



A life-long expert on the Battle of Dukla Pass, Bill Tarkulich will discuss the breadth of the revered, crucial, protracted, and bloody chapter in Slovaks' confrontation with Nazi control toward World War II. This includes intended strategy, unintended political and social results, personalities, local citizenry. The presentation will take place from 2-4 pm at Wesley W. Posvar Hall, 230 S. Bouquet St. Pittsburgh, PA 15260. Mr. Tarkulich has published several papers on Rusyn family history, homeland history, and genealogy research methods for most families in Slovakia. Many of his methods have become de-facto standards for research in Slovakia in general and the Carpathian Mountains and border lands specifically.
