GOALS AND TACTICS – 2018-20

The goals and tactics were developed following an 18-month planning process that included input from its members, chapters and branches, CRS Board and the Strategic Planning Committee.

1. Improve Board Performance

The C-RS Board of Trustees will:

- Evaluate our current board selection process
- Create a board development program to identify potential highly qualified board members
- Construct a new board member orientation program
- Create board classes so that only a third of the board will be up for election each year thus improving continuity

2. Enhance internal and external communications

The C-RS Board of Trustees will:

- Develop a series of educational webinars
- Organize traveling exhibits for use by its chapters and branches and for display at appropriate national and regional events
- Create a Speaker's Bureau to assist its chapters and branches
- Participate in appropriate Slavic and ethic events such as genealogy and educational forums, conventions and ethnic festivals

3. Develop an aggressive membership growth plan

The C-RS Board of Trustees will:

- Create a Membership Outreach and Growth Committee
- Target relationships with colleges and universities that would view CRS as an important resource for cultural programs, Rusyn archives and educational presentations
- Rotate the annual meeting location yearly

4. Improve fund raising efforts

The C-RS Board of Trustees will:

- Create a budget management process to insure that our resources are allocated in a manner that is consistent with our strategic plan
- Increase by 25% the amount of givers to the annual campaign
- Establish a major gifts program for the C-RS and our Cultural Center


