C-RS Chapter Highlights

C-RS Eastern PA's 5th Annual Rusyn Geneology and Heritage Conference

On Saturday, September 30, the Eastern PA Chapter of the C-RS had the pleasure of hosting a conference at Kings's College in Wilkes-Barre, PA. An enthusiastic audience of approximately 117 people was enthralled by four very informative speakers during the daylong history and culture conference. Chapter members were available to assist those who brought personal documents for interpretation and a basket raffle with Carpatho-Rusyn items from Transcarpathia was held. It was wonderful to see a few young attendees again this year. A few highlights from the day include:



Professor Paul Magosci signed new books especially for Bethany Sromovsky. Professor Magosci's talk on the "Myths and Stereotypes of Carpatho-Rusyns" enumerated many examples from Mahanoy City to Mukachevo, which showed that not all Carpatho Rusyns were poor, uneducated and downtrodden.

C-RS National Board Trustee ,Jean Armstrong Matthews, is flanked by Professor Magocsi and C-RS president emeritus, John Righetti, who spoke on Carpatho-Rusyn Immigration. Both men are well known experts on Carpatho -Rusyn history and immigration.





Dr. Paula Donson introduced her book "This Kind of Courage." Her grandmother, Anna, escaped an arranged marriage during the predawn hours of her wedding day to flee to a monastery for six months before her voyage to America. Full of spirit, determination and extreme courage to achieve her freedom in America she established a life that she had only dreamed about and became a role model for her children and grandchildren to achieve their dreams. Ironically, the boat left Germany September 30, 1913. Dr. Donson honored her grandmother at the conference which was also September 30, exactly 104 years later.

Father Joseph Bertha , an expert on Icons, educated us about "The Weeping Icon of Mariapocs", a Byzantine Catholic Icon which is now in St. Stephen's Dom in Vienna. The original home in Hungary is the spiritual center of faithful Greek Catholics from the Carpathian Basin. Thousands make pilgrimages to this shrine in Mariapocs.
